The following organizations can offer resources to early stage and existing small businesses:

- The [City of Chicago's Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection](#) ("BACP") offers assistance at the [Chicago Small Business Center in City Hall](#). Aspiring and current entrepreneurs can obtain valuable business planning, legal, and financial advice at the Small Business Center free of charge. BACP is the government agency that regulates and licenses most businesses in Chicago, so consulting their Small Business Center regarding zoning and other legal restrictions and licensing processes is an essential part of starting any new business venture in Chicago.
- Chicago [Neighborhood Business Development Centers](#) ("NBDCs") are local chambers of commerce and business organizations that have a strong neighborhood network and coordinate efforts with local aldermen, the City of Chicago, and other community partners. NBDCs can help businesses with start-up efforts, access to business financial resources, and business-to-business networking, among other services.
- The [Illinois Small Business Development Center at the University of Illinois at Chicago](#) assists pre-venture, start-ups, and established businesses with management, marketing, and financial counseling. They also provide assistance with business and marketing plan preparation, securing capital, improving business skills, accessing international trade opportunities, and other business management needs.
